Request for Information on Whitworth Rifles

Tom Rowe (rowebooks1@gmail.com) is gathering information on these rifles for a new book. Many Australian collectors will know of his previous works which has included his collaboration with Wal Winfer on Wal's series of books on British single shot rifles.

Anything on Whitworths and particularly the following;

1. Serial numbers. On militaries is underside of barrel at breech.
2. Markings on bullet moulds,
3. Photo of a torsion bar which is a flat piece of iron or steel that went into the end of a cleaning rod to give more purchase when turning the rod,
4. Interesting accessories,
5. Calibres, barrel lengths, marking on lock,
6. Really keen to hear of Military Pattern 1862. Easy identification is 36" barrel. Only

1000 made.

7. Weird match rifle which has a half stock typical of match rifles but has a blade front sight only (no wind gauge). They were called "Any Rifles" and are super rare.

8. Type; Military, Semi-Military, Military Target, Sporting, Match.
