# Request for Information from Barry Chisnall

Barry Chisnall author and co-author of such books as *British Non-Ordnance Military Carbines*: 1750 – 1900 and *British Cavalry Carbines & Pistols of the Napoleonic Era* has begun research

for a new book with the working title *British Ordnance Pistols*. It will cover single-shot pistols from early 18<sup>th</sup> century until the end of single-shot ordnance percussion pistols in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century. It will have detailed colour photos and a descriptive text which will include dimensions and any special features. It will describe heavy and light dragoon pistols, sea service pistols and coast guard pistols produced by the Ordnance in the Tower as well as Dublin Castle.

As with previous books the success of the project depends on being able to obtain high quality photographs of pistols held by dealers, auction houses, museums and collectors. We are, therefore, appealing to members of the forum to help us with our search for suitable images and data. We are already in a position to photograph most of the required patterns but need help with the following pistols: -

<u>Early Land Service Heavy Dragoon pistols</u>: Patterns 1703, 1715, 1719, c1722-1725, 1730 & 1738: <u>Life Guards Pistol Pattern</u> 1756: 1740-1750 and <u>Light Cavalry Pistol</u> c1750. Also included in this request are details of <u>Royal Horse Artillery double-barreled pistols</u>, of which only two are known.

The <u>Pattern 1842</u> pistol; the <u>Pattern 1858 – 1861 Lancer</u> pistol and the <u>Dublin Castle pistols</u>
Details are sought of any <u>c.1756</u> or other <u>Land Service Heavy Dragoon Pistol with the 10in.</u>
<u>barrel</u>, as also the <u>c.1760 Light Dragoon Pistols and Sea Service Pistols of the pattern 1705 and <u>c.1855 types</u>.</u>

Lastly Barry is seeking details of the <u>Coast Guard and Customs Pistols of the early 1830s, 1839,</u> 1842 and 1853 patterns and the Customs and Revenue 1839 Pattern.

If you have any of the above pistols then contact Barry Chisnall and he will send you a Specification Form which will guide you through the data and photographs required.
