## IMPORTANT NOTICE

### Postponement of the 2024 -2025 Guild Annual General Meeting

Members are advised that the AGM of the Guild which was scheduled for the 25<sup>th</sup> of August will now be held on the 29<sup>th</sup> of September. This postponement is a once off occasion and in 2026 the AGM will revert to the last Monday of August as usual.

Therefore the original scheduled date will now be just an ordinary Monday night meeting of displays and items for buy and sell.

### Notice from L&RD re Fingerprinting for Licences.

Please be advised that a new fingerprinting service for applicable Firearm Licence applicants was introduced on **Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2025.**

What stays the same:

- The applicant is required to book a fingerprinting appointment in advance and attend at a Victoria Police fingerprinting location. Fingerprinting appointments can be booked online: [Book a fingerprinting appointment | Our services | Victoria Police](#)
- The applicant is required to provide 100 points of current ID at their appointment, including a valid photo ID

What has changed:

- The applicant can select a new fingerprinting option when booking: 'Private Security, Firearms and Armed Guard'
- The applicant is required to complete a new, simplified form – the VP616 – which replaces the existing VP820B 'Consent to Check and Release National Police Record' form
- The applicant is no longer required to apply for or provide a National Police Check Certificate as part of the Firearm Licence application process. Please be aware that LRD will continue to consider national police record check information as part of the probity assessment process.

The new fingerprinting service streamlines the licence application process, as applicants no longer need to wait to receive a police check certificate before starting their licence application.

### **Notice re Licence Applications, Renewals and PTAs**

While the Guild offers email as one method of processing these, **members are advised that photographs of PTAs, licence applications or renewals will no longer be accepted.** Members must submit these for signature by a Nominated Officer in one of the following three ways

1. In hard copy with a stamped envelope addressed to either L&RD or for return to the member.
2. In a scanned PDF format, or
3. In the original .rtf (Rich Text Format) which is the file type used by dealers in their use of the online process created by L&RD. In fact this format is preferred as it is the quickest method for nominated officers to process the form and send it back to the member.

Of course members can always bring the forms to one of our monthly meetings for signature.

### **The dates of the Monday Meetings in 2025**

The dates for the Guild Monday Meetings in 2025 are April 28, May 26, June 30, July 28, August 25, **September (AGM) 29**, October 27 and November 24.

### **Notice Regarding Security and Safety at Meetings**

We note that while it is pleasing to see increasing attendance at the Monday night meetings there has been a slackening of necessary security measures by members presenting displays.

Accordingly the Committee has resolved that –

1. All registerable firearms displayed must have either cable ties locking their actions, or trigger locks, or be firmly affixed to the table by locked cables, and the display must be attended at all times. The Guild has some cables and locks and these can be supplied if requested.
2. In regard to ammunition the sale of ammunition by individual members who do not possess the necessary WorkSafe permit to sell cartridge ammunition is banned.

This does not apply to licensed dealers and members who hold the appropriate Ammunition Collectors Licence who may be presenting displays. Any members who can sell ammunition under these conditions are reminded that they need to physically confirm that the purchaser has the appropriate licence before a sale can be made.

The restrictions on ammunition display either for sale, or as part of a display is because we run the risk that someone may take a loose round and chamber it in a firearm in an unattended display. The results of that would be horrendous for the club.

We also run the risk of a spot check by a L&RD Officer. This has not happened in the past. However the future is uncertain we must assume a visit will only be looking for trouble.

### **Attendance and Participation in Monday Night Meetings**

#### **THE COMMITTEE HAS MADE ALL MONDAY MEETINGS BUY AND SELL NIGHTS**

Besides presenting displays we encourage members to bring along items for sale which can include exempt firearms i.e. pre-1900 genuine antiques like single shot percussion pistols, flintlocks etc. and other types of exempt firearms such as longarms taking obsolete ammunition.

We remind members that it would be helpful if we could have some volunteers to help set up the hall before our normal start time of 7.00 PM.

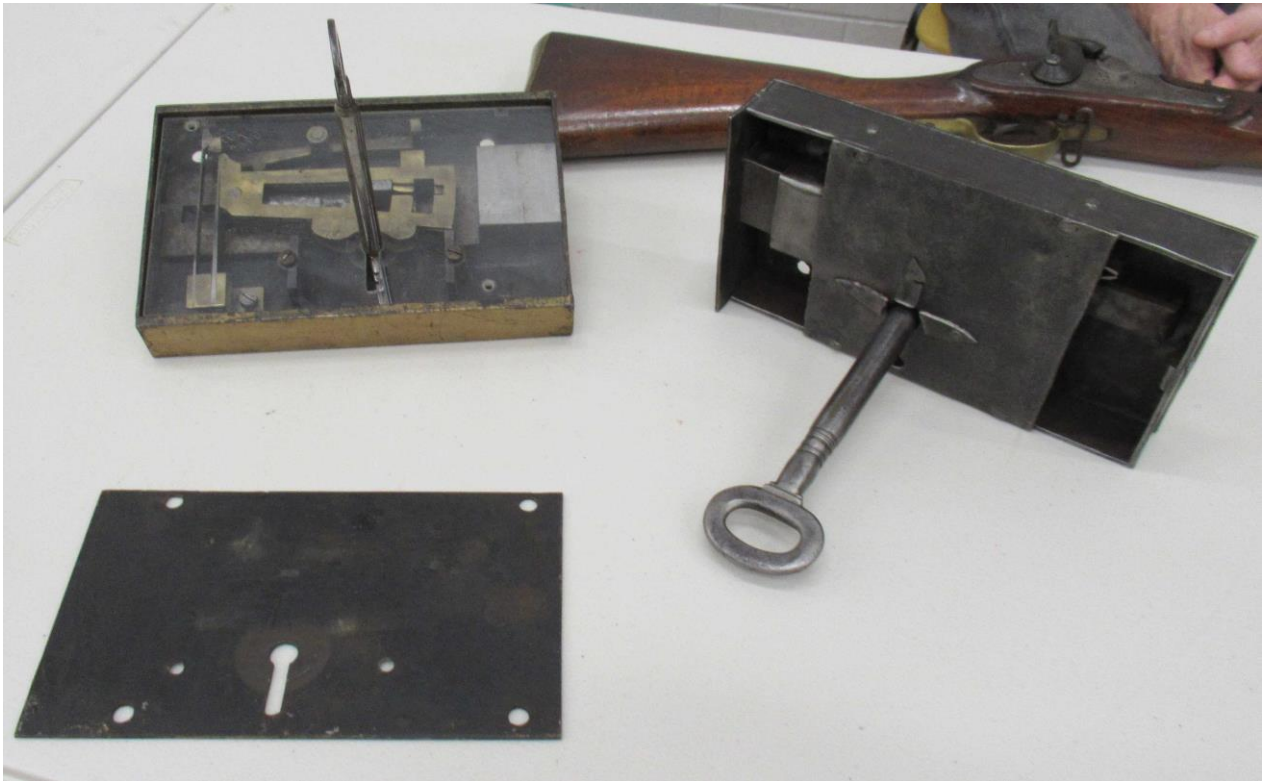
